Always serving our family, she and our father were selflessly devoted to the care of our youngest sister, Janette, demonstrating a love that will forever inspire us. Mom was never too busy to talk to or visit with any of her 5 children, 10 grandchildren, or their families, and over the last 5 years really enjoyed staying connected with everyone through Facebook. A fierce bridge player and a Words with Friends devotee, gaming remained a passion throughout her life. She also loved traveling to Europe, adored anything French, and even took French classes. An avid reader, she had a wonderfully sharp mind and might be the most competitive home Jeopardy player anyone has ever seen. She was also a fabulous cook and was never too busy to bring a meal to a sick friend. She has been a role model to us all and loved us unconditionally. She was an active member of St. John Vianney Church and her strong faith radiated throughout all of her life.
