



Betty Harriet McCutchan

February 16, 1953 - March 8, 2015

Betty Harriet McCutchan was born in Midland, Texas to Margaret and Gordon McCutchan on February 16, 1953, and died March 8, 2015 at age 62. She was a graduate of Coronado High School in Lubbock, Texas, Roanoke College in Salem, Virginia, the University of Texas School of Law, and the United States National War College in Washington, D.C.

Following 7 years as an Assistant District Attorney for Tarrant County, Betty entered the United States Foreign Service serving as a consular officer in India, Chile, Turkey, and Washington, D.C.; as Deputy Chief of Mission in Guyana, and as Regional Director of Foreign Missions in Houston.

She was a member of Memorial Drive United Methodist Church, where she sang in the choir, the American Association of University Women, PEO Sisterhood, the Daughters of the Republic of Texas, Chi Omega sorority, and the Houston Tuesday Musical Club Chorus.

She is survived by her sisters and brothers-in-law, Ann and John Schoeninger of West Hartford, Connecticut, and Carolyn and Bob Montgomery of Sherman, Texas, nieces, nephews, grand-nieces and grand-nephews.

Funeral services will be held Friday, March 13, 2015 at 2 p.m. at Memorial Drive United Methodist Church. Burial will be Saturday, March 14, 2015, at 2

p.m. at Greenwood Memorial Park in Ft. Worth, Texas.
