Brian Joseph Weierbach, 59, of Houston passed away Thursday, April 4, 2013. Brian was born March 23, 1954 in Norristown, PA to Robert and Margaret "Peg" Weierbach. He is preceded in death by his parents and is survived by his loving wife of 22 years, Narda Schaeffer Weierbach; daughter, Gabrielle "Gabby" Weierbach; siblings, Robert "Bob" Weierbach & wife Corry, Maureen Patricia Weierbach, Neal Peter Weierbach & wife Anne as well as numerous nieces, nephews and other loving family.

Brian grew up in King Of Prussia, PA outside Philadelphia and spent most summers on Long Beach Island, New Jersey with his family. He graduated from Miami University (OH) with a Bachelor of Arts. As a young man, he loved sailing and being outdoors. Brian was an accomplished haberdasher with Norton Ditto in Houston for more than 20 years. He loved working in his yard and was an avid soccer fan, spending many weekends cheering on his beloved daughter Gabby. He was on the board of S.E.A.R.C.H. Homeless Services and for many years had worked in prison ministry. He was an active member of Grace Presbyterian Church in Houston where he served as an elder and on many committees that served the church and community. Brian was a faithful servant of the Lord and a devoted husband and father to "his girls" Narda and Gabby. Brian was loved by those who knew him and will be greatly missed.

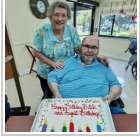
“ *Narda and Gabrielle,*
