August 1, 1918 - July 26, 2011

Carmella Louise "Mary" D'Angelo, 92, passed away peacefully on July 26, 2011 after a long struggle with Alzheimer's. She was born August 1, 1918, about a mile south of downtown Houston to Frank and Antonina Cutaia. Mary witnessed many changes to the city of her birth as it grew from a small town on Buffalo Bayou to a major metropolitan area. She graduated from Sam Houston H.S. in 1936. In 1942, Mary met Bill D'Angelo, a sergeant in the Army Air Corps from Pennsylvania, who was stationed at Ellington Air Force Base during WWII. They married on January 24, 1943 at Sacred Heart Church and remained together for 65 years until Bill's passing in 2009. Bill and Mary enjoyed travelling and visited many countries in Europe, as well as Asia and China. Mary was a devoted wife, mother, and grandmother.

She is predeceased by a son, Bernard; sisters, Rose and Phyllis; brothers Sam, Mike, Joe, and Frank. She is survived by a son, John Anthony D'Angelo and grandson John Douglas D'Angelo; sister Lena Maddison; sister-in-law Mary Cutaia, and many nieces and nephews.
