After 14 years with Cities Services, Jack continued his career in oil & gas exploration with his long-time business partner, Cecil Hollis.

Jack was a dedicated father and enjoyed spending time with his family and friends. He spent countless hours on the baseball & softball fields as the head coach for Brenda and Scott's teams. Jack had a passion for the outdoors especially hunting & fishing.
