



## Joseph Robert Trainer Jr.

March 21, 1934 - May 27, 2026

Joseph Robert Trainer Jr.—known affectionately to those who loved him as Joe or "Daddy Joe"—was a man who wore many hats throughout his life, and he wore them all exceptionally well. As a devoted son, a steadfast brother, a loving husband, a protective father, an adoring grandfather, and great-grandfather, he poured his heart into every role he undertook. His life was beautifully defined by his dedication to his family and his unwavering commitment to serving the people around him.

Daddy Joe's life was defined by his steadfast dedication, whether he was serving his country as a proud United States Marine or working with his hands at his ever-present workbench. His profound pride in the Marine Corps remained fiercely important to him until his final days. That military ingenuity seamlessly translated into a lifelong talent for discipline and fixing anything. No matter where the family lived, he found a way to build and mend, from keeping tackle boxes of essential tools while living in England to brilliantly engineering a makeshift shower out of plumbing hoses and clamps in an old bathtub. Right up until the end, his creative mind was always looking for a solution to a problem.

A veteran of the international oil industry, he spent 35 years building a distinguished career that began with Welex (1956) and culminated with Halliburton Services. His career took him across continents, including

assignments in Argentina, Peru, and Venezuela. He later served in England before finishing his professional journey in the United States, ultimately retiring in 1991.

His hands were equally skilled at the grill, where he found his greatest joy in serving others and soaking in the company of his loved ones. For Daddy Joe, cooking was never just about the meal; it was his favorite way of participating in family life and ensuring his friends and family were treated like absolute VIPs. He refused to let circumstances stop a good family cookout, once modifying a small aluminum barbecue pit with his tools so he could still grill while living in a London apartment. Even in the very last weeks of his life, when his physical strength waned and he could no longer stand as the head chef, his passion for gathering his family never faded. He continued to participate right to the end by carefully overseeing the kitchen, timing the cooking, and giving his expert approval to ensure his loved ones were still being cared for through his recipes.

A deeply dedicated soul, his passion for family led him on a remarkable journey to England to visit the plane crash site of his cousin, Edwin. Though no remains had ever been recovered, his devotion was rewarded when he returned home with a few cherished mementos—tangible pieces of the past that brought a profound sense of closure and peace to his heart.

That deep instinct to nurture extended to his boundless, unconditional generosity. Daddy Joe never thought twice or hesitated when it came to helping those he loved; his generosity was always rooted in quiet, immediate action. He bought a house for the grandparents simply to ensure the family always had a place to gather and that they were never alone on a Sunday. He constantly opened his doors to host every weekend and holiday, and provided a warm, rent-free haven for extended family members when they needed a place to land. Whether it was flying his parents to Argentina to share in family

milestones, or dropping everything without complaint to drive three hours to San Antonio to rescue stranded family members on the side of the road, he was the steadfast anchor of his family. He gave his resources, his home, and his time effortlessly, setting an extraordinary example of what it means to truly take care of one another.

He approached his final days with the exact same deliberate care and signature humor he applied to the rest of his life. True to his classic joke, he made sure to go out “feet first” with his beloved Marine Corps flag flying proudly. But before he did, he beautifully orchestrated his departure, ensuring he had the time to share meaningful moments with his loved ones and parting on his own terms once he knew his family was okay. His perfect timing was a final, graceful gift to the family he built and loved so dearly.

A Mass of Christian Burial will be celebrated Tuesday, June 9, 2026 at 10:30 AM at St. John Vianney Catholic Church, 625 Nottingham Oaks Trail, Houston, TX 77079. A reception will follow Holy Mass on the church campus. Joe will be laid to rest at Forest Park Westheimer Cemetery that same day at 1:00 PM.
