



Lorn D. Frazier Jr.

October 22, 1948 - February 26, 2021

Lorn D. Frazier, Jr. (aka “Brother”) of Houston passed away Friday, February 26, 2021, at the age of 72 after battling glioblastoma. He was preceded in death by his parents Lorn D. Frazier, Sr. and Camille Lafon Frazier. He is survived by his wife of 48 years Dawn Barrett Frazier; his daughters Megan Frazier Salch and husband Trent Salch and Colyn Frazier Bezanilla and husband Victor Bezanilla; five grandchildren Brent Salem of Trussville, Alabama, Kylie Salch, Claire Bezanilla, Camille Bezanilla and Grady Frazier Salch—all of Houston; and his sister Priscilla Frazier Phillips and her family.

Lorn attended St. Rose of Lima Catholic School in Houston, followed by Allen Military Academy in Bryan, Texas for high school and junior college. He continued to Texas A&M University where he studied construction.

A proud native Houstonian, Lorn was an underground utility construction contractor and owned Calco Contracting. Following in his father’s footsteps, construction work was the only career he ever considered. Lorn was also a former president of the Houston Contractors Association (HCA). He could operate any machinery—from the job site to his ranch in Bellville, Texas. He loved fishing, hunting, driving his truck and tractor, and spending time with his family. He also treasured trips to New Orleans to have fun with his extended family.

Lorn was the true definition of “genuine” who told people openly what he thought, while never pretending to be something he wasn’t. His humility and loyalty were remarkable. Lorn was a long-time, active member of St. John Vianney Catholic Church in Houston as well as St. Peter and Paul Catholic Church in Bellville. He will be remembered as a good man who was generous beyond measure.

Visitation will be held from 6-8 pm on Tuesday, March 2, 2021, at Dettling Funeral Home located at 14094 Memorial Drive near Kirkwood. A rosary will be at 7 pm. A Memorial Mass will be held at 1:30 pm on Wednesday, March 3, 2021, at St. John Vianney Catholic Church at 625 Nottingham Oaks Trail, where COVID protocols will be followed. 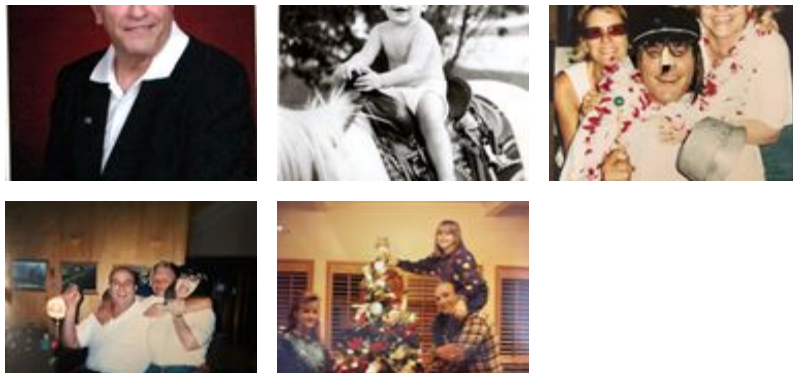
