Margaret Pollard Kuhn passed away on February 3rd, 2012. Margaret was born on December 7th, 1948 in Washington, DC. After completing her secondary studies in Maryland she attended the University of Maryland class of 1973 and South Texas College of Law class of 1976 where she earned her J.D. While attending South Texas College of Law, Margaret worked full time for Reynolds, White, Allen & Cook as a Legal Assistant. Upon being licensed to practice law in 1976, she joined the firm of William H. White & Associates. The firm changed its name to White & Pollard in 1995. In 2000, Ms. Pollard Kuhn joined Sullins, Johnston, Rohrbach & Magers. For 33 years, the emphasis of Ms. Pollard Kuhn's practice has been representing landowners in eminent domain litigation. She has tried condemnation cases in Harris, Fort Bend, Dallas, Liberty, Grimes, Brazoria, Montgomery and Travis Counties and has represented landowners and condemning authorities in numerous mediations and appeals through the Supreme Court of Texas. Ms. Pollard Kuhn's practice also includes ad valorem tax protests and litigation, commercial and consumer litigation (both plaintiff and defendant) and civil appeals. She has been a featured speaker on eminent domain in many seminars sponsored by the Harris County Attorney's Office and the State Bar of Texas.

Margaret was preceded in death by her husband Wilder, parents Wayne and Mary Pollard, and brother Jimmy. She is survived by her son Matthew, sister Mary, and brother Tom. Margaret was an avid cook who also devoted a large

portion of her life to serving the Church as a Sacristan, Eucharistic Minister, CCE teacher, and Information Czar at the parish Bazaar, among countless other services. Her sarcastic sense of humor and the love she gave to all who knew her will be dearly missed.

The Kuhn family will receive friends Tuesday, February 7, 2012 from 1:00 PM until 9:00 PM with a Vigil Service beginning at 7:00 PM at D.M.
