O. Scott Hume, M.D. beloved husband, father, “Grumps”, brother and friend died on April 27, 2011 of pancreatic cancer. He was 70. Scott was born in New York City to Robert Orne and Jeanne Richter Hume on August 22, 1940 He is survived by his loving wife of 47 years, Mary Grace and their children: Gina Vance and husband Tom (Austin); Robert Hume and wife Kimberly (Austin); Rose Sager and husband Curtis (Houston). Grandchildren: Julia, Amy and Sheri Vance; Dominic, Alexandra and Avery Hume; Alyssa, Michael and Zachary Sager. He is also survived by his sister Janice Ann Hume (Florida) and brother-in-law Frank Tropeano (New York) along with nieces, nephews, cousin and very good friends.

Scott earned his Medical Degree at Cornell Medical School in New York, completed his Ob/Gyn training and earned a Master of Public Health Degree at Johns Hopkins in Baltimore. He served in the Army at Ft. Carson Colorado and was awarded The Army Medal of Commendation. In 1974 he came to Houston to join the Dept. of OB/Gyn at UT Medical School and stayed on in Houston in private practice. He was a member of the Harris County Medical Society, the Texas Medical Association, American College of Ob/Gyn an Honorary member of the Harris County Medical Alliance and the Retired Physicians’ Organization. After his retirement he became a Master Gardener. His work with the Agricultural Extension service and lectures on Plant Disease became one of his passions. He also loved participating in the Retired Physicians’ program which helped train nursing students. He was a “hands

on” husband, Dad and Friend with a wonderful sense of humor. He was a computer wiz and loved wookworking, bicycling, classical music, opera and most of all the privilege of delivering babies. A member of St. John Vianney Catholic Church, his funeral Mass and reception will be held at the church at 10:30 am on Friday, May 6th (625 Nottingham Oaks Tr.) “ Dr. Hume delivered both of my children. It was August 7th, 1980. Hurrican Allen was expected to make landfall. I got to the hospital by 10:30pm. At 1:20am. Dr Hume told me my son's heart beat was irregular, like he was in stress. He asked me to let him help the delivery. I agreed. He quickly made an incision to speed up the delivery. The water hadn't broken, he was about to be born with the sack intact. I let Dr. Hume break the water. He said my son was wearing an Elizabethan collar. The umbilical cord was wrapped around his neck three times. He said Tim's umbilical cord was the longest he had ever seen. When Tim was 8, 8/8/88, by chance I learned the Armada was anchored for the night 8/8/1588 at Hastings. The British put eight small boats full of pitch and tar into the crescent shape of the Armada, and set them on fire. The ships cut their anchors, many sank crashing into each other, many others were destroyed in a Hurricane off Scotland. 26 ships crashed into the Cliffs of Moher. 8/8/2008, visiting his great great grandfather's house in County Clare, they asked where the Murrhy House was. It was closer to the Cliffs of Moyer. They stayed at Spanish point where the ships crashed. The boys Tim's generation were 6'6", 6'5", 6'4", 6'3", 6'2", and 6'1". Everyone wondered where their height came from. Knocking on the Murrhy door, the boy answering was 6'8".

“ I began seeing Dr. Hume in 1980 or '81 after years of infertility. When I became pregnant my husband I were over the moon. On my four month appointment Dr. Hume did an ultrasound (I had gained 26lbs!!). After a quick look, he excused himself for a few minutes and came back with nurses and receptionist and asked "do you mind if these ladies see your ultrasound?" We didn't, and the next words were "okay, here's a foot, here's a foot, but wait, here's a foot, and here's a foot". Unbelievable!! The only time in my life that I actually cried and laughed at the same time! I went into labor in the wee hours of Thanksgiving day, 1982. When I called Spring Branch Hospital to tell them I that I was on my way, I was told that Dr. Hume was not on call and they would not be calling him on a holiday. I was so disappointed! I called again and begged, "please call and let him know and I will understand if he doesn't come. but, please, please let him know!! After a very few hours of labor, in walked Dr. Hume with a bright, smiling face and we were so grateful, so happy. He brought his daughter who, I think, was home from A&M. I gave birth to two beautiful baby boys Joseph, 6lbs.11oz. and Matthew 8Lbs.1oz. My husband and I were profuse in thanking Dr. Hume for all he had done for us, to which her replied, "oh, don't thank me, thank God!". We did, and we still do every time we see those precious faces of our boys/men. But we also will be ever thankful for Dr. Hume and the beauty that he brought into our lives.
