November 11, 1969 - October 29, 2022

Stacey Lynne Hancock, 52, died October 29, 2022, after a short two-month battle with Stage 4 Metastatic Breast Cancer. She was born on November 11, 1969 in El Dorado, Arkansas. They spent every weekend together, shopping, laughing, and telling stories, and could often be seen finishing each other's sentences. When Stacey spoke of Shelby, her eyes twinkled with pride. Shelby, equally fond of her mother, is a beautiful soul and carries on Stacey's quick wit and candor.

Stacey loved her friends fiercely and loved to have a good time. She loved hydrangeas, and pink was her favorite color. 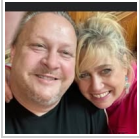

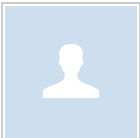
