Thomas Ainsworth Disinger, 70, passed away on November 6, 2012 in Methodist Hospital after a brief battle with cancer. Tom was born on April 12, 1942 in Batavia, New York. Tom is preceded in death by his parents Calvin and Helen Disinger of Attica, New York where he grew up. He is survived by his loving wife of 41 years, Pearllu, daughter Leslie Green, son in law Greg Green, grandsons, Brooks, Cooper, and Palmer. Additionally, he is survived by his brother Robert (Eileen) Disinger of Mt. Tom worked for many years in computer software sales with Tymshare, where he made lifelong friends. He also worked as a certified drug and alcohol abuse counselor, and for the past 20+ years, in health insurance sales with his business partner and dear friend, Bob Harris.

During his life, Tom served in the U.S. Marine Corps, as well as being a Thirty-Second degree Mason. Tom was very involved with Memorial Drive United Methodist Church and the Good News Sunday School class. His great interests were the Houston Astros, NASCAR, and a passion for automobiles,

and most of all, any and all activities with his three precious grandsons.
