When my mom spoke of Virginia it was as if Mom were speaking of a larger-than-life figure from a storybook. She meant that much to Mom. You see my mother suffered a great loss when she was young as well as a lot of abuse for which she was placed in the government's care when she was young . There was little to no hope that she would ever be okay to live a normal life without her mental and physical traumas affecting her and all of those around her in a negative way for the rest of her life. And although my mother had a lot of help and people in her life to Mentor her none ever delivered the impact that Virginia did. Virginia hung in there with my mother for over 30 years and not just with her but with us her family. I really hope as my mother does that her Legacy of being involved in the community lives on with those that knew her. For if it were not for Virginia I would not have the mother I have today. There was one charity in particular" Casa de Esperanza" that 30 some years back brought my mother and Virginia together through the idea that bad memories could be replaced with good ones and it was this concept that kept my mother from being caught and Lost in the system. Here's a glimpse of some of the things Virginia did with my mom which for my mom were a big deal considering she grew up poor and in the 80s... ice skating in the Galleria, shopping at Neiman Marcus, going out to eat at restaurants, sending flowers on my mother's birthday even when she was moved to different cities, sending care packages, paying for One summer of Girl Scout camp, going music shopping, helping Mom reunite with her sisters in a different state and meeting with our family every Christmas and many more great memories. Not only did Virginia do this and so much more for my mom to help heal the past but she also involved her family. Virginia always had a way of speaking up for those that couldn't for whatever reason. You would never know from just looking at her how many lives she really touched. The one thing she was hesitant to do but did anyways was the drive-thru at McDonald's for just french fries in her Mercedes when Mom would ask. Again you have to remember this was the 80s and my mom

grew up poor. Virginia sure did do a good job with my mom and although she did a lot of charity work that was one thing my mom loved most about her was that she never considered my mom a charity case. The one thing my mom most took away from having known Virginia was you don't have to have money to make memories and help others, time is more important than people realize so make the best of it.
